#### **Excursions**

This week, our I-EP students went on their first excursion of the academic year! Our grade one students went to the metro museum to further understand how communities make transportation systems to meet their needs. Our grade two students went to a supermarket to understand making informed choices concerning their health and well-being. Our grade three students went to the Huangpu Ancient Port to know how China traded with European nations to help their understanding of their place in the world. Lastly, our grade four students had a social worker speak to them about the risks and challenges that some children face in the world (especially in China).

The opportunity to go beyond the classroom and into the real world allows the students to see how their learning relates to the broader context of real life. Additionally, the opportunity to explore and see new things creates further questions among the students. This provides more fuel for their units of inquiry, giving students further control over what they want to learn. A very successful week in our I-EP primary school and a big thank you to our students and teachers!

# Other news: Teachers being lifelong learners

A successful teacher is a teacher that is a teacher who continues to learn. Our teachers exemplified this week by reviewing the IB learner profile and how to promote the learner profile in our I-EP students and in our teaching staff.



## **English**

As part of our effort to connect the English curriculum to Central Ideas from our Programme of Inquiry, PYP students this week focused on vocabulary and listening and speaking skills.

Grade One students learnt transportation vocabulary in line with the Central Idea: Communities make efforts to create transportation systems that meet their needs. In writing, students did an alphabet tracing activity.


Grade Two students learnt health and well-being vocabulary in line with the Central Idea: The choices people make impacts their health and well-being. In writing, students practised completing the sentence: "I live near \_\_\_\_\_ Metro station." on the worksheet.

Grade Three students learnt about Mexico, they identified Mexico on a map, compared Mexico and China. In writing, students learnt to form short sentences such as, "I like the red poncho." This is in line with the Central Idea: Our global perspective is developed through understanding our place to the rest of the world.

Grade Four students kept a record of words (risks, challenges, opportunities) and used an online dictionary to look up/clarify meanings of words and information about words. This is in line with the Central Idea: Children worldwide encounter a range of risks, challenges, and opportunities.

Next week, students will extend their learning to reading texts.





#### **Arts**

This week, our I-EP students in Grade One learnt about basic shapes and primary colours, Grade two learnt about primary and secondary colours and relating it to drawings of fruit. As grade three had their excursion this week, there was no art class. Grade four learnt about different types of composition (open and closed). In Music, Grade 1 students learnt about rhythmic patterns, in grade 2 students learnt about rhythms using boom whackers and singing songs in solfege. Grade 4 students learnt about an Indonesian folk song, and Grade 4 made their musical instruments using recycled materials.

### Chinese

G1:继续学习声母并练习声母与单韵母的拼读;学习整体认读音节和三拼音节;讨论特定交通工具的用途,并讨论在一定情境中如何选择交通工具及其原因,鼓励学生对交通系统进行更深入的探究。

G2:本周结合探究主题,我们探究了植物种子的传播方式,食物对身体健康的影响,并进行了与探究主题相关拓展性阅读。

G3:本周,三年级通过阅读、分析描写特定地点美景的多篇古诗与现代文,理解从文学语言角度,有多种方式可以表达地点。出于对探究主题的好奇与关切,通过对探究地点相关资料地寻找、阅读与分析,发展调查研究的技能与习惯。

G4: 学习书信表达;了解部分学生所面临的挑战与困难;明白"尺有所短,寸有所长"的道理。回顾复习关于儿童成长故事的单元;深刻理解文章。学习关于科技的文章、阅读材料,感知并思考儿童可能面临的机遇.



## **Maths**

I-EP小学的数学课程主要采取与探究单元相结合+单独学科的形式来教学。本周除了正常的教学,我们还迎来了各种探究活动。

一年级:通过画一画等活动学习了5以内的加法,同时孩子们发挥自己的想象力用肢体语言来表达数学符号,理解了"+""="的意义。在周五的外出探究活动中,孩子们一起参观地铁博物馆,然后运用方向的相关知识给地铁博物馆设计一个平面图。

二年级:结合探究主题,学习如何查看常见食品中蛋白质、脂肪、碳水化合物等的营养成分,收集相关数据,通过分析数据认识重量单位(克与千克);同时,孩子们也学习了连续加法、连续减法和加减混合的竖式计算。

三年级:孩子们通过查资料等方式深入探究时间与自然现象的联系,并通过一起创作时间尺来巩固24时计时法的相关知识。在周三的外出探究活动中,孩子们在黄埔古港收集了与探究有关的数据,并初步运用时间线来记录大事件。

四年级:重点巩固万以上的数的读写、比较大小和用四舍五入的方法求近似数,孩子们分组讨论如何把所学的知识向三年级的学生进行分享,表现积极。另外,孩子们在听完外邀嘉宾的讲座后进行各种数据收集,并制作图表,充分了解探究主题中全世界儿童面临的挑战和风险。

to movements in their hands, feet, and knees. In Grade 2 students discovered how to improve their overall health and fitness. In Grade 3 students learnt about physical fitness and how to make a fitness plan. In Grade 4, students made their obstacle courses and then mimicked different disabilities (such as limited vision) to complete the courses to understand how some children face challenges and risks.

In P.E. this week, Grade 1 students learnt how to skip a rope, paying attention
